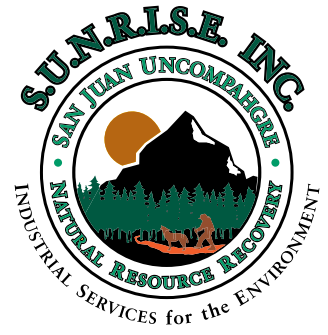


Recycling Instructions

Take lids and caps off and rinse

SUNRISE accepts the following material:

- Newspaper/magazines
telephone books
- Mixed paper/shredded paper
(in paper bag)
- Cardboard
- Paperboard (remove plastic
components)
- Paper towel and toilet paper rolls
- Recyclable plastics #1 – #7
- Tin/steel cans
- Recyclable glass
- Aluminum cans
- Metal caps and lids
- Wire
- Coat hangers

SUNRISE does not accept (as examples):

- Contaminated (dirty) recyclables (they
are more unsanitary and dirty
recyclables are the #1 reason
why recyclables end up in landfill)
- Paper towels
- Construction paper
- Glassware
- Ceramic material
- Aluminum foil
- Photographs
- Ice cream containers
- Milk and cream containers
- Cardboard juice containers
- Paper coffee cups
- Recyclable coffee lids
- Ice cube trays
- Corks

- Plastic packaging with no
recycling symbol
- Plastic bags
- Plastic caps and lids
- Styrofoam
- Batteries and electronic waste
(e-waste)
- Fabric
- Appliances
- Compostable cups, plates, and utensil
- Dog poop or poop bags
